"Our goal is to ensure that every family in Northern Rowan, especially those in underserved areas, receives the care they deserve."

The improved Northern Rowan Family Medicine facility is poised to become a cornerstone of support for Rowan County, bridging gaps in care and fostering The expansion marks a pivotal step healthier communities for years to come. Construction is already underway, with further details on the completion timeline to be announced soon.
